




### **2023/24 PRECEPT**

The Parish Council are very aware of the current cost of living crisis impacting households. However, the rate of inflation now being seen, and the subsequent price increases being applied by many contractors and suppliers, means that it is also feeling the impact. Unfortunately, this means that the Parish Council will be incurring higher costs in 2023/24. The budgets have been reviewed and cost savings made, where possible. As a result, the Parish Council Precept Budget for 2023/24 was agreed at £221,381, representing an increase of £13.57 per year on a Band D property.
