We are pleased to have taken delivery of a new 'themed' bench for the War Memorial area recently.


The bench represents the First and Second World Wars and is part of ongoing improvements, which began with restoring the lettering of the names of the fallen in 2019.

PLAY EQUIPMENT UPDATE

We often read views on social media regarding the play equipment in Barton. Some views are that the offering is poor and ask why the Parish Council do not install more exciting equipment.

Unlike neighbouring Parishes, Barton has been fortunate that there has been very little new housing development due to its location in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, Conservation Area and surrounded by Green Belt. However, this means that there is no additional funding available from Developers for the village.

Many of the parishes, compared with Barton have seen development and are likely to have benefited from Developer contributions for things such as infrastructure, leisure, roads, doctors etc. This contribution made by Developers is known as Section 106 money. In areas, such as Barton, where development has been low, there is little or no Section 106 money available to us to fund projects such as new play equipment.

You will be aware of the proposed development east of the Village (Higham Road) with up to 500 houses. This development will provide some Section 106 money for use on improving roads, schools, doctors etc. but we have been advised that there will be no contributions for the existing play areas as the new development will provide its own.

In your Council Tax bill, a small portion is paid to the Parish Council to provide the services it is responsible for - Burial Ground, maintenance of the closed Churchyard St Nicholas Church, Allotments, Sports Field and Pavilion, Bus Shelters, Benches, and the Norman Road and Arnold Recreation Ground.

Each year we set aside money for projects. The zip wire cost nearly £10,000 to install and whilst we have funds building for new equipment, it does take some time to build sufficient funds. In addition to the council tax contribution, we rely on successful grant applications however these often require match funding, meaning that we have to have as much money saved as possible.

In the past 6 years, in Arnold Recreation Ground, the Parish Council has replaced the swings, sections of the safety surfacing, removed the stockade, installed a new basket swing and zip wire and S106 money, which had been ear marked for outdoor sport, was used to fund the table tennis table.

Unfortunately, there was a setback this summer when, following the annual RoSPA safety checks, it was found that several pieces of equipment, including the zip wire, needed repair which was beyond the expected budget. The Committee are keen to bring in new equipment to our play areas and are working towards building the savings pot (Ear Mark Reserve) and grant opportunities in the coming years.
