PLAY EQUIPMENT PROJECT - UPDATE

Following the public survey earlier in the year and visits to Arnold Academy and Ramsey Manor Schools to speak to pupils, we reviewed the feedback on what you like and don't like, and the improvements you would like to see in the Recreation Ground.

Your feedback told us that you want - a slide, tunnel, climbing equipment and equipment suitable for younger and mid aged children so that families with children of all ages can play in the same place

With the lack of housing developer money (section 106 money) to fund the project we submitted a grant to the UK Shared Prosperity Fund, administered by Central Bedfordshire Council, and were excited to hear the news that our application was successful. Due to the high number of applicants the amount awarded was less than applied for. However, due to the importance of the project, it was agreed that it should go ahead, and Parish Council funds will be used to bridge the gap.

The project costing £45,500 will include 4 new pieces of equipment aimed at younger and mid aged users -2 multi play units incorporating a slide, a climbing net and see saw. The new equipment will be positioned away from the flood area, and the play area will be extended with new fencing and gate.

Whilst the installation is in progress the play area will be closed with strictly no admittance. We anticipate the start date will be week commencing 25th November and it will be completed before Christmas.

Whilst funds do not allow new equipment in the Norman Road Play Area at this time, you may have seen that a new picnic bench was installed over the summer and repairs to the safety surfacing will be completed soon. The Working Group will continue to explore ways to improve its play areas, as funds allow.
