80th ANNIVERSARY VICTORY IN EUROPE DAY



In 1945, Barton celebrated with a thanksgiving service at the Parish Church and the service was attended by close to 400 people. Afterwards the bells were rung.

80 years ago on 8th May 1945, people took to the streets to celebrate the end of the war in Europe.



During the day homes were decorated and at night, coloured lights provided illumination and there was dancing until the early hours of the morning (Luton News 16th May 1945)

80 years on, the Village will commemorate this historical event on Thursday 8th May 2025.

Plans are underway for the Baking Competition, events at the Library and Beacon Lighting which includes a performance from Barton Community Choir. The Church Bells will be rung at 6.30pm.

Womens Institute – Victoria Sponge Recipe

Ingredients

170g softened butter or soft margarine 170g caster sugar 3 medium eggs 170g self-raising flour Raspberry jam to fill

Method

Set the oven to 160°C (fan) / 180°C / Gas Mark 4 Grease and line the bottom of 2 x 20cm/8" sandwich tins

Cream the butter/margarine and sugar very thoroughly until pale in colour

Beat the eggs then gradually add them to the mixture, beating well each time

Sieve the flour and fold lightly into the mixture. Check the consistency of the mixture—if it is too thick you can add a little milk or water

Divide equally between the 2 tins and bake for 25 minutes in the middle of the oven. They are ready when they are golden, shrunk from the sides of the tin and spring back when touched.

Remove from the oven and place on a cooling tray

Peel the paper off (if used) and fill with raspberry jam when cold and finish your cake with a light dusting of caster sugar on top

Tips - Traditionally the cake is made by weighing the eggs in their shells and then using this weight for each of the fat, sugar and flour. Remove butter from fridge to soften before use
