PLEASE NOTE THAT TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURES WILL BE IN PLACE
BETWEEN 10.30AM - 11.30AM ON SUNDAY 9TH NOVEMBER TO ALLOW THE
REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY SERVICE AND PARADE TO ST NICHOLAS CHURCH
TO TAKE PLACE SAFELY.

Roads affected are: Hexton Road from the junction with Manor Road (including all adjoining roads) to the Luton Road junction. Luton Road from the Sports Field entrance to Hexton Road and Bedford Road from Hexton Road to Sharpenhoe Road Roundabout including the slip road and off shoot roads.

Why has a fence been installed at the Luton Road Sports Field?

You will have noticed that new fencing has recently be installed at the Luton Road Sports Field. We understand that this is not a popular decision for everyone, but it follows continued issues of antisocial behaviour, drug dealing/taking, dogs off lead and fouling not being picked up. These have been an issue for many years, and we have tried to tackle them by engaging with users, displaying signage regarding the rules and public order offence relating to dog fouling not being picked up.

Our staff, Bedfordshire Police and Central Beds Councils Community Support Officers have engaged with users but sadly some have chosen to ignore the rules and there has been verbal abuse and threats made to staff.

Although the area has been used by some dog walkers, it is a Sports Field and not a public recreation space or right of way. The cost of the fencing has been met from income rather than public funds and installation was completed inhouse and with volunteers rather than by an outside contractor to minimise the cost.

It is sad that this action has had to be taken but we hope you will understand the reasons. Dog walkers are still able to use the access road which runs along the Sports Field as well as the Recreation Ground, the hills, neighbouring pathways, grass verges and public rights of way.

The Parish Council is responsible for the following facilities for the Village:

- providing and maintaining Recreation Facilities at Arnold Recreation Ground & Norman Road Play Area
- promoting sustainability by overseeing 92 Allotment plots
- supporting grass roots football and fitness, providing 9 football pitches and a pavilion with 6 changing and referees rooms at the **Luton Road Sports Field**
- upkeep of the Village street scene, maintaining the Bus Shelters & pockets of land under Parish Council ownership, including management of trees and hedgerows
- influencing the future of the Village environment through developing a **Neighbourhood Plan** for Barton and consulting on planning applications
- maintaining the Burial Ground and looking after the closed churchyard of St Nicholas Church
- custodianship and upkeep of the **War Memorial** area & organising the annual Remembrance Sunday service & events
- responding to vandalism and littering, providing bins, keeping the Village a pleasant place to be
- creating policies and managing resources to use precept funds for the greatest benefit of the Village including awarding small grants to local organisations

Central Bedfordshire Council are responsible for:

- · Highway maintenance: potholes, resurfacing, drainage, street lighting and road safety
- Waste Management: emptying village general and dog waste bins, dealing with fly-tipping, removing graffiti
