With regard to the Local Plan, the Planning Inspectorate has made a number of requests which will need to be addressed by CBC by the April 2020 deadline. In addition, the Inspector has come down heavy on the plans for the M1 - A6 link road which have been approved by CBC.

The new lights for the Village Hall have been installed, the radiator in the Parish Office has been replaced and is now working correctly.

Subject to ratification of the Policies & Resources committee minutes (next item) the Health and Safety contract with Peninsula has been renegotiated for 26 months, starting from November. The previous contract, including the HR element, has been concluded.

383.3 To consider and approve the S137 Grants for 2019/20

Following the Policies & Resources meeting when grant applications were discussed, Councillor Selley reported that he had visited Barton Kids Club to find out more about their project. It was agreed that a grant of £250.00 should be awarded to Barton Kids Club. Members then agreed that the Village Hall should be awarded a grant of £246.00 to purchase crockery and glassware for the kitchen. The additional awards will take the overall S137 grant applications over the Parish Council's agreed spend. The overall spend for S137 grants for 2019/2020 will be £3,221.00.

Councillor Davison-Williams **PROPOSED** approval of the S137 Grants, with an overspend of £221.00, **SECONDED** by Councillor Roberts and **UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED**.

To acknowledge Came & Co Local Council Insurance company Intra-group reorganisation following acquisition by Arthur J Gallagher Insurance Brokers Ltd - acknowledged.

## 19/384 BURIAL GROUNDS COMMITTEE REPORT/UPDATE

384.1 Matters arising from previous Burial Grounds committee not included within agenda - information only

The Assistant Clerk has not been able to reach the carpenter regarding the repair works to the burial ground sign.

The topographic survey of headstones within the burial ground took place on 6<sup>th</sup> November. The report will follow shortly.

UK Power Networks have advised they have postponed the works to replace the 2 pylons at the burial ground until after a frost and the ground firms up. The date for the tree works within the burial ground is yet unknown.

St Nicholas Church have advised that they have registered for 'Bell ringing' for the VE Day 75 year commemoration.

The standard roses within the Garden of Rest will be removed shortly. New roses will be planted as soon as possible.

The contractor advises that he will carry out hedge cutting works in the burial ground and churchyard next week. He has raised concerns over a silver birch in the Garden of Rest which is covered in ivy. **ACTION:** Assistant Clerk to contact CBC Tree Officer for advice on this.

A headstone within the Garden of Rest in St Nicholas Churchyard was found to have broken and has now been laid down. Reverend Johnson has been made aware of this.

Councillor Thomas reported that the Remembrance Sunday service held on 10<sup>th</sup> November went very well with large numbers of residents attending both services. The sound system worked well and the service could be heard at the back of the crowd. The road closure was not implemented due to lack of volunteers and the late notice that the closure had been approved. This will be looked at for next year's service. Councillor Thomas thanked the bugler for performing the Last Post and Reveille and the Assistant Clerk for organising and giving her time on the day.



To receive the minutes of the Burial Ground Committee meeting held on 4<sup>th</sup> November 2019 and to consider and ratify any recommendations contained therein

A copy of the minutes was previously circulated to members. Councillor Thomas **PROPOSED** approval and ratification of the minutes of the meeting held on 4<sup>th</sup> November, **SECONDED** by Councillor Day and **UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED**.

To consider and approve the permitted height of a flat memorial stone, regulation point 9.3

At the Burial Grounds meeting on 4<sup>th</sup> November, a number of amendments were made to the fees and regulations to allow a wedge plaque as well as flat plaques, to be place on grave spaces. Members were unable to agree the height of a flat stone as the average height was unknown at that time. The stone masons have now confirmed that the average height is 2". Following this clarification, Councillor Thomas PROPOSED point 9.3 of the Regulations be amended to read: A flat stone plinth maximum size 12" deep x 19" wide x 2" height. The proposal was SECONDED by Councillor Gardner and UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

Letters have been sent to Ramsey Manor Lower School, PTA, Football Club, Pre-school and Kids Club regarding parking on Manor Road. The Pre-school have now included a section on parking in their latest newsletter, Kids Club have put a message on their Facebook page.

A resident copied the Parish Council into an email they have sent to Central Bedfordshire Council complaining about the state of repair of the pathway outside 17 Grange Road, which resulted in a resident tripping and hurting her leg.

The Groundsman has repaired the Village Signs on Hexton Road and Sharpenhoe Road. He was thanked for his work repairing both signs.
